Conservation Director Larry Gullett gave a presentation on the Conservation Strategic Plan (Strategic Plan), the Conservation Bond, and the changes to Conservation over the last eight years. Peter Lane Coach and Consulting LLC Owner Peter Lane spoke about the goals and the agenda for the day. Meeting attendees introduced themselves.

For the next small group activity, participants split into six small groups to discuss each focus area of the Strategic Plan. The small groups provided feedback on each focus area.

5. Wrap-Up

Sullivan spoke about Atkinson's support for the Conservation Bond and her service to the Conservation Board and Johnson County.
